- b. Following are the division that points will be awarded. Points will only be awarded for any registered highland.
- c. If necessary, each division may be split into several classes at the discretion of each individual show committee.
- d. Sovereign, market heifer and steer classes are set to the discretion of the show committees.
- e. There is no charge for group classes, but please indicate group class on entry form.
- f. Be sure to include the name of sire for Get of Sire and name of Dam for Produce of Dam

## 2025 Fair Health Requirements – Cattle

### Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)

- Cattle, sheep, goats, swine, llamas, alpacas, deer, and misc. ruminants require a valid CVI to enter the fairgrounds.
- The CVI must be issued by a Category 2 accredited veterinarian.
- All animals must be officially identified. ALL MANMADE ID MUST BE RECORDED. Refer to Animal Identification section below for more information.
- Only one species is allowed per certificate.
- The type and duration of certificate required depends on the origin of the livestock.

### New York Origin Livestock:

- A valid intrastate CVI (AI-61) is required.
- Each animal must be individually identified on the CVI (see below).
- The CVI must be issued on or after May 1 of the current year.

### Out of State Origin Livestock:

- All animals entering New York State must satisfy import health and test requirements for that species and be accompanied by a valid interstate CVI.
- The interstate CVI is valid for 30 days from the date of CVI inspection. During the fair season (July 1 through Labor Day) valid CVI's can be used multiple times for entrance into fairs. The initial entrance into a NY fair must be within 30 days of the date of CVI inspection. In order for the CVI to be used for a later fair, it must be dated and initialed by a NY state official noting the location of the initial fair. A change in health status or eligibility of an animal necessitates the generation of a new CVI

### Animal Identification

- ALL MANMADE ID MUST BE RECORDED
- Cattle must be identified by an official USDA approved eartag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) eartags, commonly referred to as "840 RFID tags," are required.

### Rabies Vaccination

- Rabies vaccination is required for all species for which there is a USDA licensed vaccine available (cattle, horses, sheep, dog, cat, ferret) and that are 4 months of age or older on the date of admission to the fair.
  - For most rabies vaccines, the earliest age allowable for primary vaccination is 3 months. Animals that are vaccinated prior to 3 months of age will need to be re-vaccinated according to label before entering the fairgrounds.
  - Vaccine must have been administered within the past 12 months. The exception is Imrab LA vaccine used in sheep which protects for 3 years after the second annual vaccination (consult your veterinarian).
- The rabies vaccination requirement must be met on the day of admission even if the animal was previously admitted to a fair when too young to vaccinate

### BVD-PI Testing

- All cattle, llamas and alpacas exhibited at NY county fairs or the State Fair must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI). The testing veterinarian is responsible to make sure the proper test is conducted. This is a once in a lifetime test that must be reported on the required certificate of veterinary inspection. The issuing veterinarian is responsible for verifying the validity of the test, the identification of the animal and recording the test date on the CVI. If a previous test is not verifiable the test must be repeated.

**AHCA SANCTIONED REGULAR POINT SHOW**  
**Information & Requirements**

1. Only Highland cattle owned by AHCA members may participate. All animals must be registered with the American Highland Cattle Association or the Canadian Highland Society.
2. **Entry fee is \$5.00 and is due by July 14<sup>th</sup>, 2024. There is NO bark bedding available, please bring your own. There are NO LATE ENTRIES.**
3. **There will be hay and straw for sale at the fairgrounds. Please contact Dick LeClar (315-794-6185) to make arrangements and for prices.**
4. Camper facilities are available on the grounds. Contact Dick LeClar (315-794-6185) for additional details and application.
5. Animals can arrive at the Boonville Fairgrounds after noon on Friday, July 25<sup>th</sup> or Saturday, July 26<sup>th</sup> by 10 am and can leave after the show on Sunday, July 27<sup>th</sup> at the discretion of the show committee.
6. Exhibitors are required to post a 10"x12" card over each animal stating: Name, Registration number, Date of Birth, Sire & Dam (optional).
7. Exhibitor's number must be worn on their back while showing. **Show attire is a collared shirt, neat pants, no ball caps and no farm logos on apparel. Scottish attire acceptable.**
8. Farm signs and decorations or personal exhibit are encouraged.
9. A designated location will be provided for manure.
10. All cattle must be tied with a neck rope in addition to a regular halter.
11. The show Committee will make stall arrangements.
12. The exhibitor is responsible for the health of their animal. **IMPORTANT** The show committee has the right to call for the services of a veterinarian for the treatment of an animal that is sick or injured if the exhibitor is not available. The fee must be paid by the exhibitor prior to the release of the animal by the show committee.
13. Any animal deemed uncontrollable by the Ring Steward will be excused from the ring.
14. Rule violations will be handled by the Show Committee.
15. Artificially altering the natural conformation or structure of an animal is strictly prohibited for this event. In addition, the use of growth hormones is forbidden. Every exhibitor bringing its animals to the show represents the animals as being free from unnatural alterations and growth hormones. Each exhibitor also agrees to submit entries to any inspections deemed necessary by the show committee.
16. The Show Committee will use reasonable diligence to ensure the safety of exhibitors after their arrival and placement, but in no case will they be responsible for any loss or damage done to, occasioned by or arising from any animals or articles on exhibition. The exhibitors shall indemnify the Show Committee, and the Fair Association of all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. The placing of any exhibits on the show grounds by any and all signify their agreement to abide by this rule.
17. Bull over a year old must be shown with rings or nose leads.
18. Premier Breeder & Premier Exhibitor awards will be given to the breeder or exhibitor having the highest number of points based on a maximum of the five highest placing animals in the single classes owned by that breeder or exhibitor. Points shall be awarded as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> – 5 pts., 2<sup>nd</sup> – 4 pts., 3<sup>rd</sup> - 3 pts., 4<sup>th</sup> - 2 pts., 5<sup>th</sup> – 1 pt. No points for Division or Grand Champions.
19. **All Cattle need health papers, rabies, BVD-PI, and shipping fever vaccinations as well as RFID tags.**
20. AHCA Rules for Sanctioned Shows
  - a. Exhibitors must be members in good standing of the American Highland Cattle Association or the Canadian Highland Cattle Society.
  - b. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor and registered with AHCA or the Canadian Highland Cattle Society.
  - c. Registration papers must be presented to show officials or AHCA representative upon request.
  - d. Tattoos must be legible and correspond to registration papers.
  - e. Use of hormones or steroids in animals exhibited is prohibited.
  - f. Breeding cattle may not be dehorned.
  - g. Exhibitors agree to abide by the IAFE (International Association of Fair and Expositions) National Code of Ethics.
21. Animals in all group classes must be purebred, registered Highland Breeding stock.
22. Crossbred Steers and Heifers must be at least 25% highland, may be unregistered, dehorned and body "clipped." Per the change in the American Highland Cattle Association Roll of Excellence rules for 2021

*only REGISTERED* pure and crossbred market animals and sovereign heifers will count towards the premier breeder and exhibitor awards at all ROE shows. NON-Registered steers and market heifers may be shown but will *not* count towards Premier breeder and Exhibitors' points. Steers and market heifers will require entry fees and compliance with all other health regulations and rules.
